Message from the Principal

The end of the year is quickly approaching and the school is a hive of activity. In the last few weeks we still have a swimming carnival, stage 1 excursion, presentation assembly, Year 6 Farewell, school reports and a school rewards day. It promises to be a great end to a great year!

School Captains 2020

Last Monday I had the privilege of listening to Year 5 students present a speech on why people should vote for them as the new 2020 school captain. I was impressed with the high quality of speeches and their ability to confidently speak in front of an audience (for some it was their first time!). Congratulations to all who spoke and I cannot wait to announce the winners at the school presentation assembly on Friday 13 December.

Cyber safety

The school has recently become aware of an Instagram page that students in the school may be accessing from home. The page presents information on specific children and their family and asks them if it is correct. The next question is "show or cover". This then allows the information to be made public. Other schools in the region are also being targeted with this and similar Instagram pages.

I strongly recommend you report this page. The more reports, the quicker the page will be shut down. To make a report on Instagram:

- 1. Tap the icon ...
- 2. Tap Report
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions. (Use the reason 'underage child information').

Classes for 2020

Teachers have used their professional judgements and I have processed individual parent requests, to create classes for 2020. At this stage we will have 21 classes. Children will find out their 2020 teacher and class mates before the end of the year.

Forming new classes is always an exciting and challenging time as friendships may change. Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions:

When I get my child's class placement, can I request that it be changed?

Class placements are considered final. Changes to placements are rare due to the fact they often cause a chain reaction and impact on the class balance. While we feel we consider the individual child during the placement process, parents must realise their child is part of a complex equation.

You may talk with the Deputy Principal or Principal about your concerns and be assured that those concerns will be shared with the teacher as they are expected to have the skills to help children adjust.

What if my child is having difficulty in his/her new placement after school has started? Can we request a change then?

Parents need to talk to the classroom teacher in the first instance. They may then speak with the Assistant Principal, Deputy Principal or Principal, so the child's needs can be addressed and the issue resolved. We acknowledge that the start of the academic year can be a challenging time for students. We ask that parents give their child and the classroom teacher at least five weeks to settle into a new class before any requests are made regarding a change. Teachers and students need to have a sufficient period of time to learn about each other, develop relationships and establish routines.

Parents play a significant role by being as positive and encouraging as possible to their children in this process. If you have any more questions, please feel free to contact your child's classroom teacher, the Deputy Principal or the Principal.



BAXTER MCDONALD

On November 17 - 24, Baxter McDonald represented Shell Cove Public School in the NSW u/12 Boys PSSA Cricket Team. This tournament was held in Adelaide. Baxter was selected from 5 days of trials around Wollongong last month. Selectors watched on as 160 boys tried out from all the NSW regions and 12 students were chosen.

Baxter's first game was played against South Australia and they won! Baxter scored 30 runs, the second highest score of the match. On the second day of the tournament he played against Northern Territory. They won again! Their third game was against Victoria. Unfortunately, they lost this game by only 7 runs.

Baxter and his NSW Team came third out of Australia (8 teams) winning the Bronze medal. The NSW girls team won Gold; so combined NSW won the overall National Cricket Competition!!!

Well done. This is an amazing achievement and we are so proud of Baxter and the positive way he represents our school!









In 2019 we introduced Ethics classes during the scripture timeslot at Shell Cove PS. The goal in 2020 is to be able to have every student who has nominated Ethics to be able to attend a class. To do this we need more volunteer ethics teachers. Teachers receive full training through online modules and a comprehensive 2 day workshop. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers will have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available Wednesdays 2-2:45pm and be able to commit to teach for a whole year.

Grandparents and other members of your family and friends' network might also be interested in volunteering, so please speak to them about volunteering.

Each week children discuss a topic from the approved Primary Ethics curriculum. Ethics classes include scenarios, poems and stories, group work and activities to encourage the children to think about what they should do in different situations, about how those circumstances might make a difference and about the consequences of their actions.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness

They are encouraged to think about the impact of their actions, not just on the people close to them, but also on the broader community.


Cookbook News

School Travel - Term 4 2019

2020 School Travel Applications Now Open

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019. Students progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 no longer need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to

https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.






